DIRECTIONS TO THE EVENT VENUE:

<u>From I-5 South</u> take exit 258 toward North Salem. Turn right onto Portland Road NE and follow to Sunnyview Road. Turn left onto Sunnyview Road and follow to the venue. You will pass 17th Street and continue a short way. Signs will be posted, and you will turn left into the second driveway and follow past the Amphitheater to Cascade Hall.

<u>From I-5 North</u> take exit 256 toward Silverton. Turn left onto Market Street NE and follow to Evergreen Avenue. Turn right onto Evergreen Avenue and follow to Sunnyview Road. Turn left onto Sunnyview Road and follow a short way by a field. Signs will be posted, and you will turn right into the first driveway and follow past the Amphitheater to Cascade Hall.

Entry & Parking: Entry for sellers, vendors and exhibitors on Friday night and Saturday morning will be through the doors on the west side of the Cascade Hall building, which faces the Jackman Long building. The public will enter through doors on the north side of the building, both Saturday and Sunday. You may park in any of the lots surrounding Cascade hall, unless there is an event at the Jackman Long building, in which case we may be restricted to the north and east parking areas. We will notify you prior to the event if there are restrictions, or if a different entry will be utilized for sellers, vendors and exhibitors.




Hotel Reservations

SALES AREA RULES

Following are the rules if you are participating as a seller in the bird sale:

- Setup and check in for birds is Friday, October 24th from 6pm to 8pm, and Saturday, October 25th from 7am to 8:30am. The sale is open to the public on Saturday from 10 am to 3 pm. Breakdown may begin at 4pm.
- Full tables are available for \$75 for the entire show day. Only CCC members in good standing may rent table space. All sellers may sell only birds or bird related items
- Sales tables are not arranged by category. Tables are assigned in the order that registrations with payment are received before the sale, or are received at the sale by the Sales Manager, Randi Smith. If you have reserved table space ahead of time, your table space is marked with your name and you may set up immediately.
- Members renting tables are solely responsible for the care and sale of their birds, as well as all funds collected.
 Sick or injured birds may not be offered for sale and must be removed from the sale table immediately at the request of the Show Manager and/or Sales Manager.
- If a member renting a table wants to participate in other aspects of the show, they may assign another person of their choice to sell their birds or bird related items on their behalf.
- For safety reasons, regular sized cages may not be stacked more than two high. Tall cages may not be stacked. Product may not be stacked beyond a safe and prudent level. In all cases regarding safety, the decision of the Show Manager or Sales Manager is final.
- Birds that may be included in the sale include canaries, finches and other species that are part of the finch and softbill class, and small hookbills. The sale definition of "small hookbill" is birds that are no larger than a cockatiel or kakariki. Larger birds will not be allowed.
- Only birds being offered for sale by members who have rented tables, or birds registered to be judged at the show, will be allowed in the building.

CANARY SHOW RULES

- Only canaries bred and closed metal banded by the Exhibitor will be permitted in the judged divisions and eligible for awards. Purchased canaries will only be allowed in the display exhibits. No plastic bands are allowed in the canary Divisions.
- 2. Type canaries are to be shown in their designated show cages, and Colorbreds (Red, Yellow and White Ground) will be shown in the proper box cages. All wire cages and all wire fronts will be painted black. Show boxes will meet standard requirements. Only black bot tom glass tube drinkers or white bottom plastic mini-drinkers will be used where there is no provision for a standard drinker.
- Cage bottoms will be covered with a mixture of three parts canary seed and one part rape seed (standard Roller Mix). There should be enough seed to last three days. No fresh fruit or greens may be given prior to judging.
- 4. Exhibitors will be charged a \$3.00 entry fee for each canary entered in the show. The Entry Chairman will collect these fees.
- 5. Birds will be kept on display until checkout times. This rule will be strictly enforced. All show birds must be checked out by designated Club officials.
- 6. Entry forms and tags will be provided by the Entry Chairman and must be filled out prior to entry.
 - A. Complete and sign the Entry Form, then turn it in to the Entry Chairman along with your entry fees. You will receive a carbon copy of the entry form. Keep this handy as you will need this copy of the entry form to check out your birds.
 - B. Fill out the front of the show tag completely using the classi fication schedule printed in this show catalog for the proper Class, Section and Division information for each entry.
 - C. Include the Exhibitor's name and address in the designated area on the tag.
 - D. Describe the bird that you have entered in the DESCRIPTION area of the tag. For example: Red Ground Lipo chrome, Intensive Red Hen, Ticked Yellow Norwich Cock, etc.
 - E. Novice show cage tags shall be marked with the a letter "N" in the upper left-hand corner of the front side of the show tag. To qualify as a Novice, and for a Novice award, an Exhibitor shall have raised canaries for less than 5 years and have not won a major award (Division or higher) in more then 2 of those 5 years.
 - F. Junior show cage tags shall be marked with the letters "JR" In the upper left-hand corner of the front side of the show tag. To qualify as a Junior, and for a Junior award, an Exhibitor must be under 18 years of age.
 - G. A show cage tag may be marked with both the letters "JR" and the letter "N" if both designations are applicable to the Exhibitor.

- 7. The Show Stewards will review the completed information on each show cage tag and will staple each tag closed so the Exhibitor's name remains hidden until the judging is finished.
- 8. The Show Stewards will seal all cage doors. After sealing, the cag es shall not be opened for the duration of the show except in an emergency and only by the Show Stewards.
- 9. No bird or show cage will be moved without the permission of the Show Manager and only under the supervision of the Show Stewards.
- 10. Judges will preview the classifications of all birds prior to judging to ensure that correct classifications have been made.
- 11. The Show Manager has the authority to add new classes, sections or divisions and to combine and/or cancel existing classes.
- 12. Judging will commence at 10:00 am on Saturday. The decisions of the judges will be final. Exhibitors can view the judging provided they do so in a non-disturbing manner.
- 13. Only the Stewards and other designated show staff are permitted in the vicinity of the staging area and the show bench while the entries are being judged.
- 14. All Colorbred and Type birds will be judged according to the irre spective standars of excellence.
- 15. Disqualification rules for all birds:
 - A. Any injured or sick bird (healed injuries such as a missing toe are acceptable, but where there are two equal birds, the one which has not been injured will win).
 - B. Birds showing any nasal discharge.
 - C. Birds which are wheezing or have labored breathing.
 - D. Birds having an unhealthy appearance.
 - E. Birds having lice or mites.
- 16. The winner of each division shall donate a bird for the Show Auction the following year. Donated birds should be of show quality, hatched the year of the show, and from the same lines as the division winning birds.
- 17. All Exhibitors are expected to help clean the show hall when the show is finished. Disclaimers: The greatest possible care and attention will be given to all birds entered or displayed in the show and sales room. The Columbia Canary Club waives all liability for loss or damage to the birds from any cause during the show or in transit. Furthermore, the Columbia Canary Club assumed no responsibility for claims of advertisers or the goods or services they promote.

FINCH AND SOFTBILL SHOW RULES

- Birds that have bred by the Exhibitor, as well as birds purchased and owned by the Exhibitor for at least 6 months
 will be permitted in the judged division, and eligible for awards. Closed metal bands, open metal bands, closed
 plastic bands, open plastic bands, as well as no bands, are all acceptable in the finch and softbill division.
- There are no specific cage requirements for finches and softbills, other than that they need to be flat topped. Cage
 size should be appropriate for the size of the bird entered. Plain square or small rectangular cages work best, as
 well as breed-appropriate show cages. The bird should be able to turn around comfortably without damaging its
 feathers. No heavy or ornamental cages please. Cage floor should be covered with paper or pellets. Wood shavings
 are not allowed.
- 3. All entries must be supplied, by the Exhibitor, with a sufficient amount of food and water for the duration of the show. A drinker should be attached to the outside of the cage or show box where the bird can easily access it, but where it does not impede the judge's view of the bird. Seed dispensers/dishes should be placed as to not impede the judge's view of the bird. If using a show box, seed should cover the bottom of the box. No fresh fruit or greens may be given prior to judging.
- 4. Exhibitors will be charged a \$3.00 entry fee for each bird entered in the show. The Entry Chairman will collect these fees.
- 5. Check in time will be from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm on Friday, and from 7:00 am to 8:30 am on Saturday. Check out time will be on Saturday at 4:00 pm. Birds will be released following the Awards presentation on Saturday afternoon. All show birds must be checked out by designated Club officials.
- 6. Entry forms and tags will be provided by the Entry Chairman and must be filled out prior to entry.

After the form is completed and signed, it needs to be turned in to the Entry Chairman along with entry fees. You will receive a carbon copy of the entry form. Keep this handy as you will need this copy of the entry form to check out your birds.

Fill out the front of the show tag completely using the classification schedule printed in this show catalog for the proper Class, Section and Division information for each entry.

Include the Exhibitor's name and address in the designated area on the tag.

Novice show cage tags should be marked with a letter "N" the the upper right hand corner of the front side of the show tag. To qualify as a Novice, and for a Novice award, an Exhibitor shall not have won a major award (Division or higher).

Junior show cage tags shall be marked with the letters "JR" in the upper right hand corner of the show tag. To qualify as a Junior, an Exhibitor must be under 18 years of age. In some instances Junior Exhibitor will also be Novice Exhibitors, so be sure to mark your show tags accordingly. Move your entries to the staging area upon completion of the show tag.

7. The Show Stewards will review the completed information on each show cage tag and then will staple each tag closed so that the Exhibitor's name remains hidden until the judging is finished. The Show Stewards will then seal all cage doors. After sealing, the cages shall not be opened for the remainder of the show except with per mission from the Show Stewards. No bird or show cage will be moved without the permission of the Show Manager and only by Show Stewards.

- 8. Disqualification rules for all birds:
 - A. Any injured or sick bird (healed injuries such as a missing toe are acceptable, but where there are two equal birds, the one who has not been injured will win.)
 - B. Birds showing any nasal discharge.
 - C. Birds which are wheezing or have labored breathing.
 - D. Birds having an unhealthy appearance.
 - E. Birds having lice or mites.
- 9. The winner of each division shall donate a bird for the Show Auction the following year. Donated birds should be of show quality, hatched the year of the show, and from the same lines as the division winning birds.
- 10. All exhibitors are expected to help clean the show hall when the show is finished.

SMALL HOOKBILL SHOW RULES

- Birds that have bred by the Exhibitor, as well as birds purchased and owned by the Exhibitor for at least 6
 months will be permitted in the judged division, and eligible for awards. Closed metal bands, open metal bands,
 closed plastic bands, open plastic bands, as well as no bands, are all acceptable in the small hookbill division.
- 2. There are no specific cage requirements for small hookbills, other than that they need to be flat topped. Cage size should be appropriate for the size of the bird entered. Plain square or small rectangular cages work best, as well as breed-appropriate show cages. The bird should be able to turn around comfortably without damaging its feathers. No heavy or ornamental cages please. Cage floor should be covered with paper or pellets. Wood shavings are not allowed.
- 3. All entries must be supplied, by the Exhibitor, with a sufficient amount of food and water for the duration of the show. A drinker should be attached to the outside of the cage or show box where the bird can easily access it, but where it does not impede the judge's view of the bird. Seed dispensers/dishes should be placed as to not impede the judge's view of the bird. If using a show box, seed should cover the bottom of the box. No fresh fruit or greens may be given prior to judging.
- 4. Exhibitors will be charged a \$3.00 entry fee for each small hookbill en tered in the show. The Entry Chairman will collect these fees.
- 5. Check in time will be from 6 pm to 8 pm on Friday, and from 7:00 am to 8:30 am on Saturday.
- 6. Entry forms and tags will be provided by the Entry Chairman and must be filled out prior to entry. After the form is completed and signed, it needs to be turned in to the Entry Chairman along with entry fees. You will re ceive a carbon copy of the entry form. Keep this handy as you will need this copy of the entry form to check out your birds. Fill out the front of the show tag completely using the classification schedule printed in this show catalog for the proper Class, Section and Division information for each entry. Describe the bird that you have entered in the Description area of the tag.
- 7. The Show Stewards will review the completed information on each show cage tag and then will staple each tag closed so that the Exhibitor's name remains hidden until the judging is finished. The Show Stewards will then seal all cage doors. After sealing, the cages shall not be opened for the remainder of the show except with permission from the Show Stewards. No bird or show cage will be moved without the permission of the Show manager and only by Show Stewards.
- 8. Judges will preview the classifications of all birds prior to judging to en sure that correct classifications have been made. All small hookbills will be judged according to the North American Parrot Society (NAPS) standards.
- Judging will begin at 10:00 am on Saturday. The decisions of the judges will be final. Exhibitors can view the judging provided that it is done in a non-disturbing manner. Only the Stewards and other designated show staff are permitted in the vicinity of the staging area and the show bench while entries are being judged.
- 10. Disqualification rules for all birds: A. Any injured or sick birds (healed injuries such as a missing toe are acceptable, but where there are two equal birds, the one who has not been injured will win.) B. Birds showing any nasal discharge. C. Birds which are wheezing or have labored breathing. D. Birds having an unhealthy appearance. E. Birds having lice or mites.
- 11. The winner of each division shall donate a bird for the Show Auction the following year. Donated birds should be of show quality, hatched the year of the show, and from the same lines as the division winning birds.
- 12. All Exhibitors are expected to help clean the show hall when the show is finished.


